#### **General Rules**

- 1. All exhibitors must have adequate public liability insurance such as BHS gold membership.
- 2. It is the exhibitors responsibility to check if the show is still taking place due to bad weather.
- 3. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry.
- 4. The organisers reserve the right to cancel or amalgamate any classes.
- 5. The organisers accept no responsibility for loss or damage, injury or accident to spectators, exhibitors or riders or their property as a result of attending this show. Please take appropriate care to prevent such accident or loss to yourselves and others.
- 6. The decision of the judge is final.
- 7. Hard hats with chin straps must be worn at all times when mounted or handling horses. Hats which have EN138/BSEN1384 or VG1 01.040 (2014-12) along with another accepted standard, will be permitted. For example, BSEN1384 & PAS015 (2011) along with the BSI Kitemark or Inspec IC mark will be acceptable, but not BSEN1384 on its own.
- 8. For the safety of yourself, body/face piercings are not permitted when riding and handling the horses including ears, nose, lip, tongue etc.
- 9. Objections or protest must be made in writing to the secretary accompanied by a fee of £25 which may be forfeited to the show funds in the event of the objection being over-ruled.
- 10. No litter is to be left on the show ground. CLEANING OUT OF HORSE BOXES AND TRAILERS IS STRICTLY FORBIDDEN Please take all droppings with you as this is a playing field.
- 11. Under no circumstances is any animal to be exhibited under a judge who is known to have bred, leased, sold or produced said animal.
- 12. All grooms entering the ring must be correctly dressed and must wear a helmet in the ring (standard above).
- 13. Lead Rein competitors must be aged 3yo and over and the lead rein must be fixed to the nose band. Snaffles only in lead rein classes.
- 14. Spurs not permitted in Equitation classes.
- 15. No horse or pony to be left unattended tied outside a horsebox/trailer.
- 16. Whips not to exceed 75cms (30inc).
- 17. Due to vehicle (4 ton axle) weight restrictions on the show ground please can we ask all competitors, where possible, to arrive in a 4x4 and trailer or 3.5 ton horse box. Vehicles which appear to be overweight will be weighed and may be turned away please contact the show organiser to reserve an overweight space.
- 18. The organisers retain the right to ask any rider to dismount if they are considered too heavy for the horse or pony being ridden.
- 19. May I remind everyone to please travel your horse/pony with their passport, it's the law (spot inspections may occur).
- 20. Colts and stallions must correctly bitted and only be handled by individuals who are 18yrs old or over. Animals must be identified with a ribbon in the tail and/or a bridle badge.
- 21. Mistreatment of any animal on the show ground will not be tolerated, the competitor/handler may be asked to leave the show ground.
- 22. Dogs must be kept on a lead AT ALL TIMES and cleaned up after. Barking dogs may be asked to be taken to a quiet place away from horses/ponies.
- 23. No canter/galloping outside of the competition and warm up rings.
- 24. No lunging anywhere on the show ground.

Horses and ponies are not to come onto the field if their flu injections are not up to date. Only horses and ponies who receive their yearly booster or horses/ponies who are restarting (must be7days or more after their 2nd injection) will be permitted onto the show field. We may ask to see their passport to check their vaccination record.

## **Equifest**

This Show is affiliated to Equifest, taking place at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 1st – 4th August 2024. The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify. You do not need to be a current Equifest member to enter or qualify for the qualifying classes.

#### TGCA TOYS In Hand and Ridden Classes Affiliation Number TGCA/00/00/00

No known breeding required to enter these classes

**TGCA Breed** classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show "TOYS". Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs.

**Part Bred** classes, are open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the part bred finals at "TOYS". Exhibits must have one parent that is pure bred traditional gypsy cob.

**Stallions –** All stallions (pure or part bred, four years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class **MUST** be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and have their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, **MUST** be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook.

Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature.

Non-members **MUST** receive a qualification card from the judge and have **21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification.** Please refer to www.tgca.co.uk for further details including membership, horse registration and showing rules (contained within the members handbook).

### Championships

**Quest for a Star Championship - TGC -** 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule.

ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship. Membership card and Members qualification card (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS.

**Go for Glory Championship - PB** -1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA part bred classes may go forward to the Go for Glory Championship. For 2024 TOYS qualifiers, the handler/rider and exhibits (apart from stallions) do not have to be TGCA members/registered on the date of the show. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championships at TOYS.

#### The Greatest Gelding Award

The award is aimed to encourage the showing of geldings, therefore creating a market for often unwanted colt foals and enabling the creation of a network of potential performance prospects to represent the best Traditional Gypsy Cob breed in the World at the highest level.

This Award should be given to the highest-placed registered Traditional Gelding and Part Bred Gelding. The judge will award this within the classes/championship

Each rider/handler must pay £2 towards first aid. You only pay this once.

#### Discount on 4 classes -

A handler/rider booking 4 classes pays £35 instead of £40 (book before the day and can be used on more than one horse)

- Class 39 JUNIOR RIDDEN MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND Mares and geldings, 4 years old & over, registered in the respective pure bred Stud Books of Connemara, Dales, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Shetland and Welsh Section A, B, C & D. Riders of Small Breeds not to have attained their 14th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Riders of Large Breeds not to have attained their 18th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

Classes may be divided as follows: ● Open Lightweight Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms. To be shown hogged and trimmed. Riders any

- Class 44 EQUIFEST OPEN MAXI COBS Open Maxi Cobs, mare or gelding 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms – to be judged as a Cob. To be shown hogged and trimmed. Riders any age. Classes may be divided
- Class 45 EQUIFEST RIDDEN PIEBALD / SKEWBALD Open ridden Piebald / Skewbald stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over. Riders any age. The first three places will also qualify for the BSPA Championship subject to their show rules & conditions.
- Class 46 EQUIFEST OPEN RE-TRAINED RACE HORSE Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, any height. Horses must have been raced in the GB to be eligible to compete.
- Class 47 BRHHS EVERSLEY RIDDEN HEAVY HORSES Open to horses, 4 years old and over that are registered in the main British Stud Books of the Shire, Clydesdale, Suffolk or Percheron Society at the time of qualification and must be entered in the name and ownership they are registered. Qualification to be awarded no lower than third place if the winning horse has already qualified. At shows where there is no Ride Judge a stand/individual show will be required. Riders will be required to give a short individual show at walk, trot & canter or set show lasting approximately 2 minutes. Change of rein and lengthened strides in trot and canter must be shown. Rein back, (optional) stand still and obedience to the leg. Horses should leave the ring at a walk or trot. Entries will not be asked to jump. If there is both a Ride and Conformation Judge a marking system will be used: Ride / manners Conformation / type assessment marks to be awarded out of a possible 50. marks to be awarded out of a possible 50. When judging classes using the Marks System horses should be stripped for the Conformation Judge. Where there is an equality of marks, the ride marks take precedence, however if there still remains a tie then the Ride Judge's decision is final. If an exhibitor declines the Judge's ride the horse will not be placed.
